Since the number of established sports car clubs in the area is about fifteen, and since there is seldom a week passes which contains less than two or three events of some nature, it was proposed by Dr. McPheron, and seconded by Gladys Hawkins, that rather than compete with these organizations for dates, the Jaguar Club members would join in the events as participants or workers. In this manner, the membership would be able to enjoy themselves without the necessary drudgery of planning anything more than gasoline and rest stops or help at check points, etc.
