EDITOR'S NOTES

JAGUAR, GM, FORD. Jaguar makes a leap for independence. GM's plans to protect Jaguar's independence are expected to be given to shareholders probably before you read this. follows GM's official announcement concerning Jaguar and GM being keen to collaborate in "certain venture The GM negotiating arrangements". team is led by GM Europe president Bob Eaton who brought Lotus under GM's wing and has protected that firm's management from interference from Detroit. GM plans to gain 29.9 percent holding in Jaguar which can strengthen Jaguar's R & D and marketing resources. GM's announcement now places Ford's bid to buy 15 percent of Jaguar, who have continued to describe Ford's move as unwelcome - stay tuned for further perils to Jaguar.

It is the day after I wrote the above and I have a knot in my stomach - why? Because Ford plans to acquire Jaguar for \$2.38 BILLION and GM passes.

The "friendly" acquisition ends several weeks of jockeying to link up with the prestigious Jaguar car maker. Ford said they paid a premium for the Jaguar name and would invest heavily to turn the British producer into a much bigger producer, doubling or tripling its output and have it manufacture a high-volume car that would sell for \$30,000 to \$40,000. The king is dead - long live Jaguar. I for one am fortunate to have owned four (still have one, a 1978 XJ6L) pre-Ford Jaguars. Also Jaguar may have to tolerate GM and Ford each owning 15 percent until the December 1990 expiration date of the British government restriction on owning a greater share of Jaguar. "It's never been done before, but it could happen", John Egan says.

F-TYPE IN 1993. Maybe it's a moot point now, but Jaguar had planned an XKF to be introduced 20 years after its last XKE (E-Type) sports car went out

of production. Code-named XJ41, the car would be available as a coupe or convertible and would be powered by either the 4.0-liter straight-six from the 1990 XJ6 or a twin-turbo version of the same engine said to produce 400 hp, enough to propel this missile to 200 mph. This version would have fourwheel drive. Chassis, suspension, and transmission are borrowed from the XJ6, though a new 4-speed automatic or 6-speed manual transmission could be in the pipeline. The coupes would come first followed by the convertibles (roadsters). The XJ220 supercar has been axed by Jaguar and if it decides to go ahead with a supercar it will be based around the twin-turbo race engine.

JaguarSport, which recently introduced its 6.0-liter XJR-S sport coupe, has released a 250 hp XJR 4.0-liter sedan. It replaces the XJR 3.6-liter sedan. The new car is said to reach 60 mph in 6.7 seconds with a top speed of 150 mph.

JAGUAR RACING, ETC.

Castrol JAGUAR

The IMSA Camel Grand Prix of Southern California at Del Mar on October 22, 1989 was dé javu as Jaguar won the season finale - all over again and with it the largest purse in IMSA history (\$180,000). It was two wins in a row and the third of the season for Jaguar and also the first time that the two Jaguars entered were XJR-10s.

My race coverage commenced Thursday evening with a nice reception at Performance Jaguar for the racing team. I had a chat with Price Cobb who now resides close to Evergreen, Colorado which I have visited many times having been born and raised in Denver, but this was a long time ago. But I digress, let's get to the track.

Qualifications were a surprise with the first row on the grid being filled by the pole winning Spice/Pontiac of Wayne Taylor with the Spice/Chevy of Bob Earl beside him in 2nd. When the race started Taylor led early and then Earl muscling by, with both pulling away from Brabham (Nissan), Price Cobb

(XJR-10), Willy T. Ribbs (Toyota), Lammers (XJR-10), and Jochen Mass (Porsche). Just before the first full course yellow, the Spice/Chevy (Taylor in the Spice/Pontiac had to made a tire stop) led Brabham, now in 2nd, by 17 seconds. Earl had to make a fuel stop under the yellow and when the green came out Brabham was in the lead, Earl in 2nd, and Lammers in 3rd. Then Lammers moved into 2nd past Earl. Chip Robinson in the other Nissan had retired leaving Brabham with the season championship if he finished the race. Lammers meanwhile was having brake-balance problems. Then a full course yellow came out and as it wore on, the fans started to boo at delay of the green with just over 20 minutes left in the race. Cobb in the other XJR-10 was several laps down after a forced pit stop with boiling brake fluid, but had found a setting to the Jaguar's liking. Ouickly the instructions were radioed to Lammers who made the adjustment. When the field at last took the day's final green, with 4 minutes left in the race

Lammers was all over Brabham like a coat of paint. Brabham didn't do a big slide going into turn 1, but it was enough of a hole to let Lammers in and once by he did to Brabham what the Nissan had been doing to him earlier in the season, he flat pulled away and raced to victory in the Jaguar XJR-10. Brabham and Robinson will be back next season with a radical new design, but Jan Lammers and Price Cobb have the momentum and I wish them all the best for next year. Jan Lammers in the Castrol/Jaguar XJR-10 car No. 61 was 1st, Geoff Brabham in the Electramotive/Nissan GTP-ZXT car No. 83 was 2nd, and Price Cobb in the Castrol/Jaguar XJR-10 car No. 60. was 7th.

The final 1989 drivers championship point standings were as follows: 1) Brabham, 230; 2) Robinson, 219; 3) Cobb, 193; 4) Nielsen, 154; 5) John Andretti, 112.




