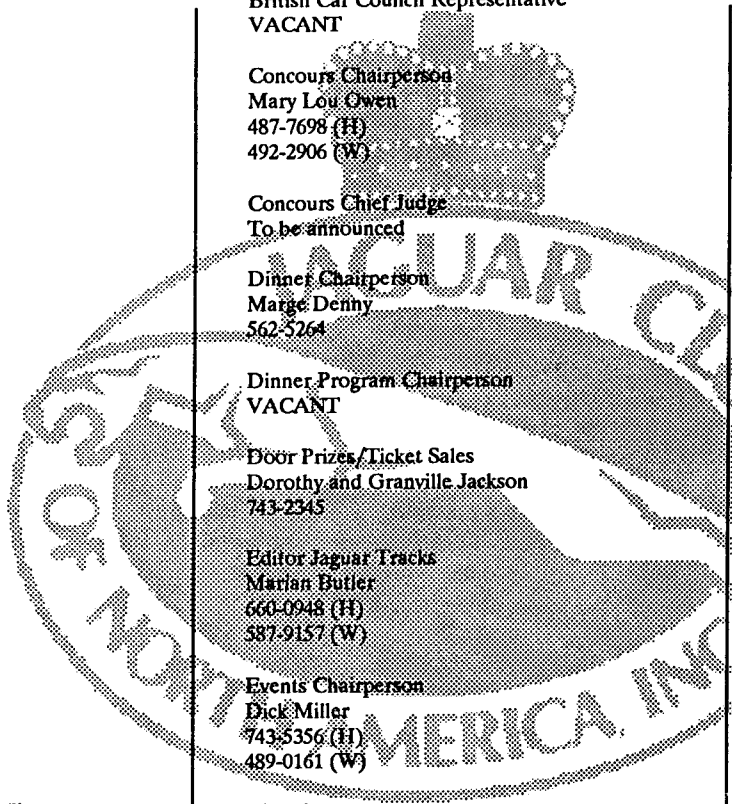

JAGUAR RACING, ETC. ●●●



●●● If there is one word to describe the IMSA Camel Sunbank 24 Hours at Daytona, it would be WET - at least for qualifying, practice and the first half of the race. The TWR team had brought two BudLight Jaguar XJR-12s, powered by V-12 engines (car numbers 2 and 3). Moments into the first session on Thursday, disaster struck the Jag team. John Nielson had a large accident on a wet track. He had a problem in the chicane and backed into the berm, which separates the track from a huge pond in the infield. He had a big impact and Jag #3 was damaged too severely to be repaired. Davy Jones qualified the #2 car in second position. He sat next to Bob Wollek in one of two Joest Porches, who was the fastest qualifier. Too bad Davy Jones didn't get the pole because, as it turned out, he could have used the points that go with it this season. The race started in a slight drizzle which turned into heavy rain. Davy and co-drivers Derek Warwick, Scott Pruett, and Raul Boesel managed to keep car #2 battling for the lead in spite of the very bad weather and, as darkness came on, they took the lead. This held until around 1 AM or 9.5 hours into the race when the first of the malfunctions struck and Raul brought the XJR-12 in amid great clouds of steam. The water pump was changed. Finally about 6 AM (14.5 hours) the Jaguar was retired after replacing the water pump (2nd time) and the radiator. Davy Jones and company finished 30th place with no points. The race was won by a Joest Porsche 962 driven by Hurley Haywood (5-time winner here), Winter, Jelinski, and Pescarolo. Remember when Hurley drove for Bob Tullius' Group 44 in the Jaguar XJR-5? Incidentally, Geoff Brabham, Chip Robinson, and

Derek Daly in the Group C Nissan (fastest car in the race) garnered 2nd place and the points to go with it. Chip Robinson also drove for Group 44 at the same time Hurley Haywood did.

...FLASHBACKS The design and development of the Jaguar XJ13 was covered in the last issue of this newsletter. What was the eventual destiny of this beautiful and functional sports/racing automobile?

The Jaguar XJ13 sat for over a year under wraps until 1967 at which time the works decided to run it. The driver picked was David Hobbs and the car ran very well, lapping at 161 mph with 175 down the straights. Best of all everything stayed in one piece with no major problems. But by that time the car was about two years out of date with the trend being to double the tire width, which would have required extensive

redesigning and rebuilding. This was in August of 1967 and work had begun on the production V12 engine using a single-cam unit instead of the dual overhead cam of the XJ13 engine. It was decided to utilize the car for publicity purposes in conjunction with the launch of the series III E-Type V12 in April 1971. On April 20, 1971, while filming a publicity film, a tire blew on a banking at high speed with the car clipping a lip-fence and turning over several times without injury to the driver. The XJ13 was eventually rebuilt (a story within itself) and, while never raced in competition, it stands today as a reminder of what further glory might have been achieved by Jaguar Cars Ltd.

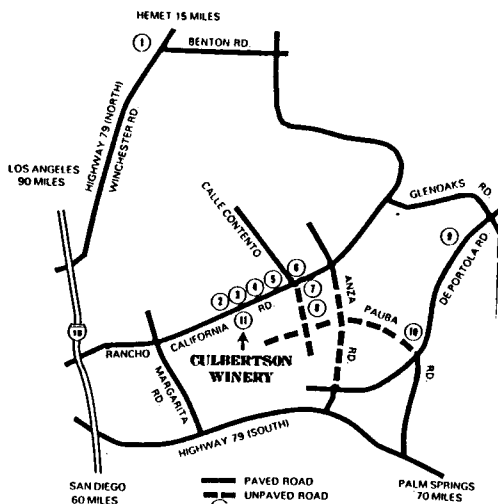
Seventeen Mile Drive...

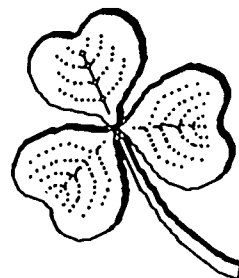

Our rendezvous point is at I-15 and Hwy 79 (head East) and look to the left for a perfect private street in

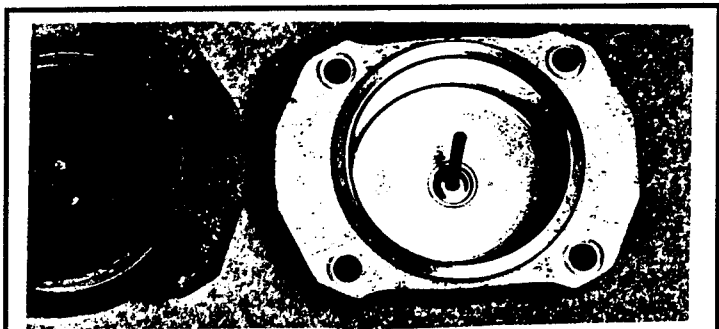

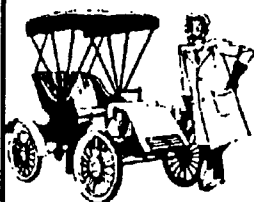
