attendance and will be again this year.





Western States 1994 Bend Oregon

Marilyn and I worked in a trip to Florida for a family reunion before attending the Western States Meet. We left San Diego at 5 a.m., July 1 with a spectacular display of lightning as we crossed the Lagunas. We stopped at Langtry, Texas, where Judge Roy Bean dispersed justice West of the Pecos and on the New Orleans where Andrew Jackson defeated the British in the War of 1812. We spent a month in Florida, and then drove furiously back to San Diego in three days, rested, repacked, and returned to the road, on our way to Bend!

It's a two day drive to Bend, the first one being pretty bleak and desolate. The second day, we were treated to snow-capped mountain and dense forests. In Southern California you forget what "green" really means.

At the Inn of the Seventh Mountain, just a few miles out of Bend, where the meet took place, we met up with Dick Cavicke and renewed acquaintances with other Jaguar club members at the cocktail hour on August 3.

The event was sponsored by the Jaguar Owners Club of Oregon, and as with everything Barbara Grayson and crew does, it was carefully planned in every detail. Bright sunshine and cars parked on the grass was the setting for the JCNA Concours. Over 60 cars were present on the green with a display of SS cars from CJA. Dick and I can almost forgive the Concours Committee for dressing the Judges as clowns, complete with huge, red, polka dot bow ties, bowler hats and white fingerless gloves. Marge and Tom Denny came by for the Concours, but tactfully refrained from any comments on our official Judges' Uniforms. A MK-II and XK-150 attained perfect scores in their classes. The high scores of all the winners, announced at the banquet that evening, reflected the excellent condition of the cars presented for judging.




