Jags were prominently placed side by side as you entered the infield including those belonging to Dick and Ginny Cavicke (best of marquee award)

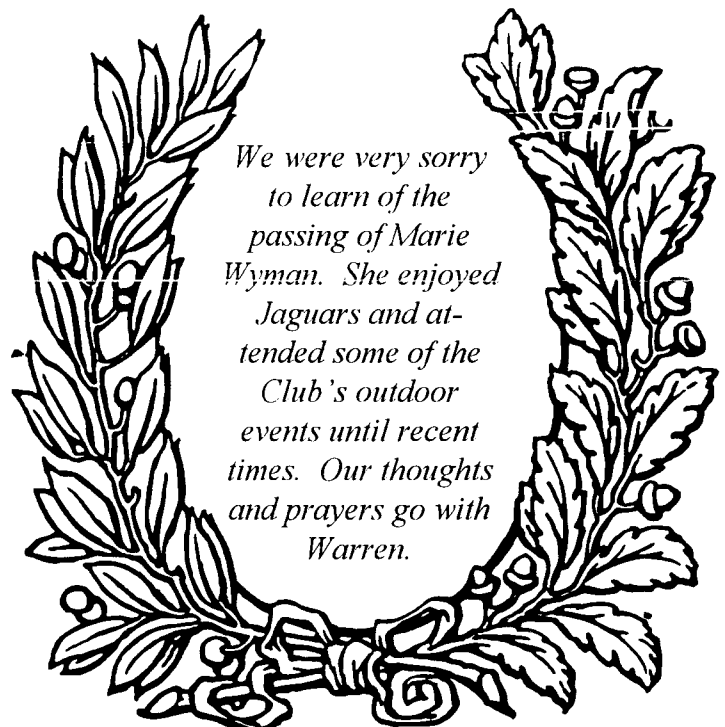


New Business: Discussed elections of new board members and slate of officers for 1995. Harvey Ruben nominated for First Vice President.

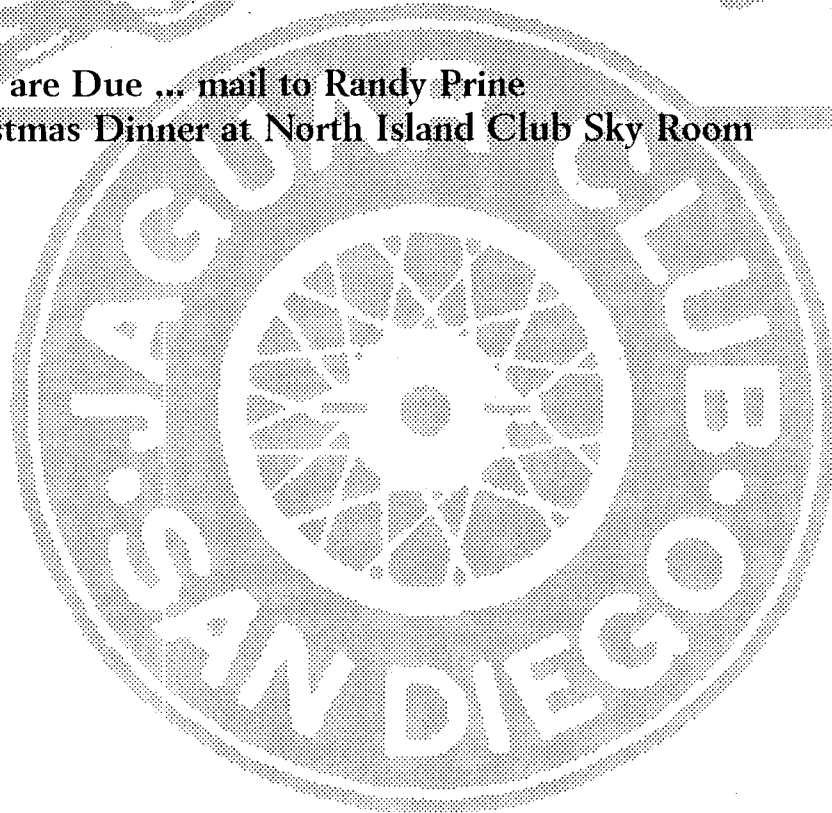

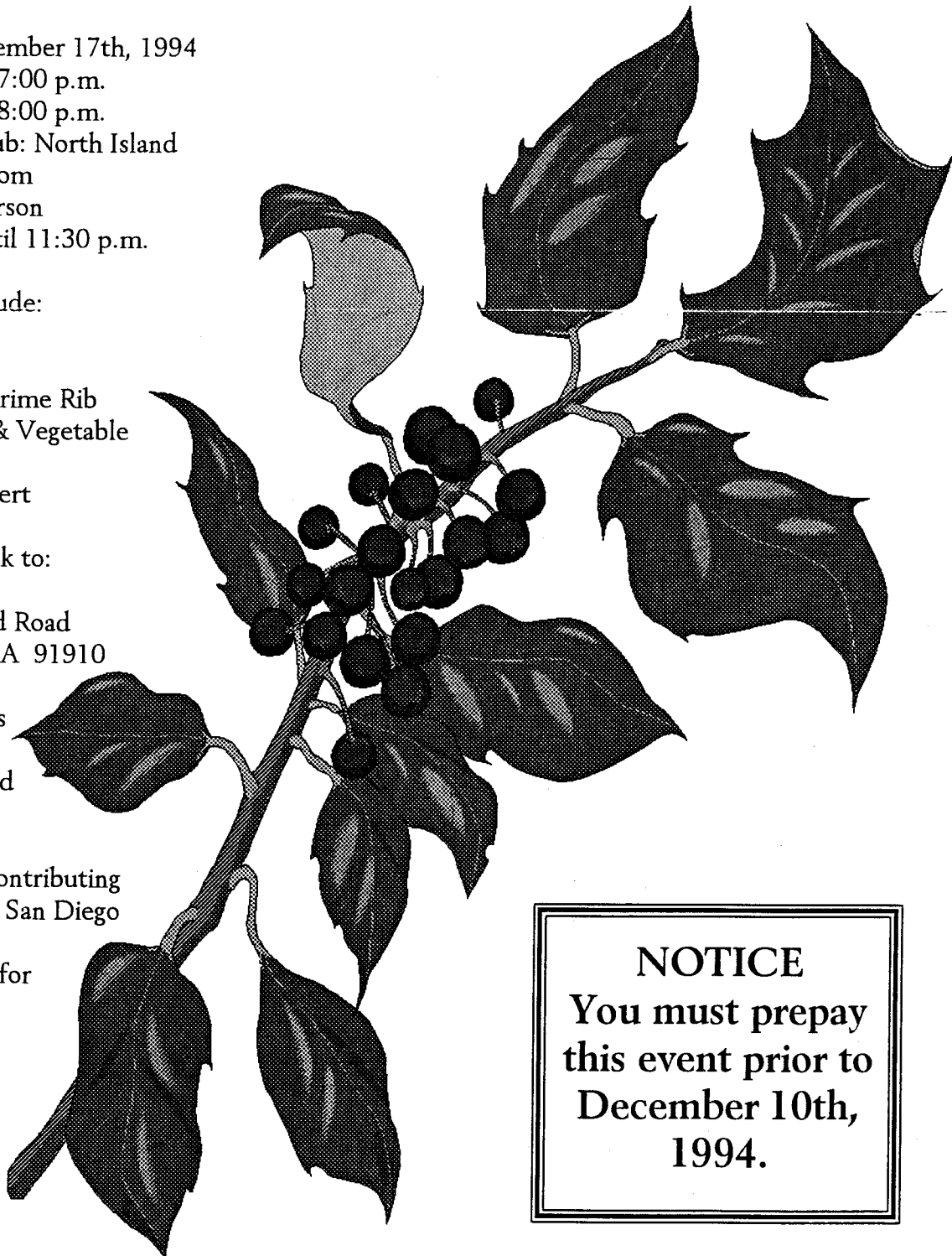

CJA FALL MEET VENTURA

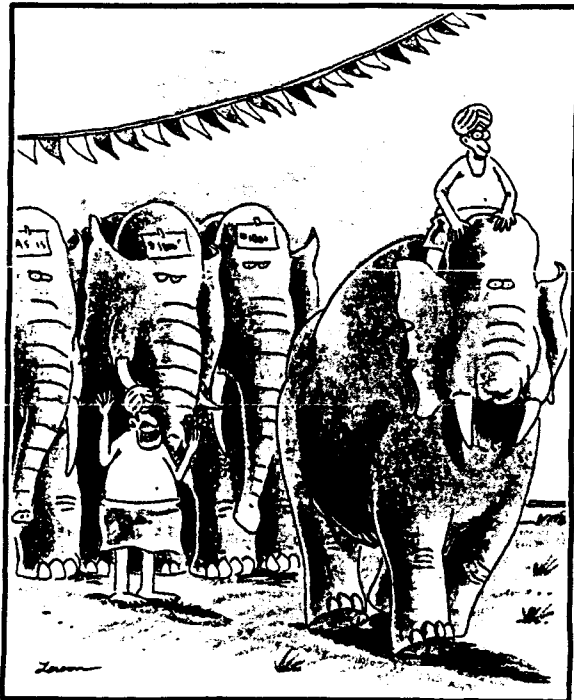
October 1 and 2

Randy and I represented the SDJC at dinner Saturday night at the Colony Harbortown Marina Hotel in Ventura, arranged by Herb & Lorraine Foster. It was a relaxing, casual affair with about 25 people attending. Although we drove the farthest, President Bob Gillette beat us by a thousand miles, flying in from Wisconsin and miraculously showing up in a 150-S! How did he do that?

Sunday we met at the hotel and caravanned to the Santa Paula Airport where we were joined by Marion and Fraser Gladwin. The field, which was dedicated in August 1930, is owned by the pilots who also own their own hangars. The first Sunday of each month they display their vintage airplanes and conduct tours. 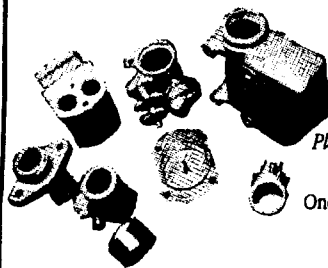

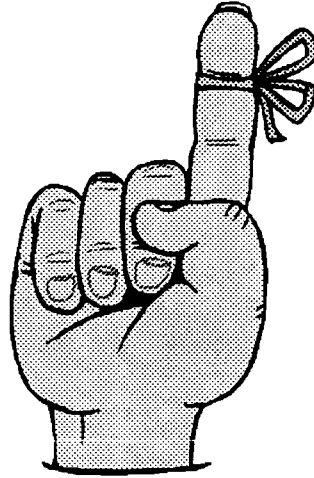
