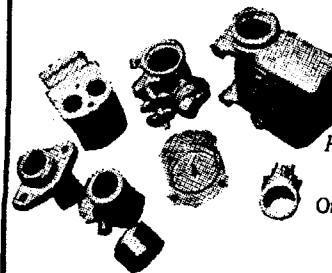

**Minutes:** Approved as submitted.

**Treasurer Diane Ward:** Cash on hand \$2,386.24. Sent check for \$200 deposit on Christmas dinner.

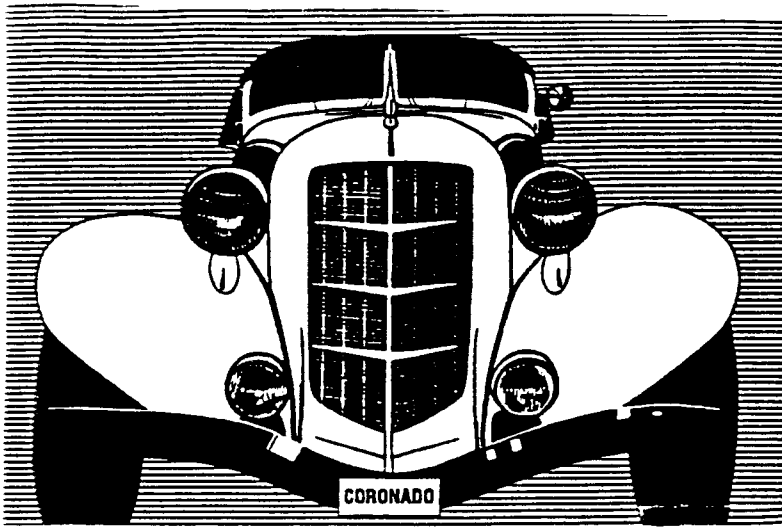

Registration costs are: \$15.00/vehicle, two or more veh. \$15.00 for 1st entry, \$10.00 ea. additional entry. Remember, refunds will be limited to cancellations received not later than three (3) working days prior to the event, or at the discretion of the Director. This is a very popular car show and the number of entrants is limited; all entries must be received by April 7, 1995.

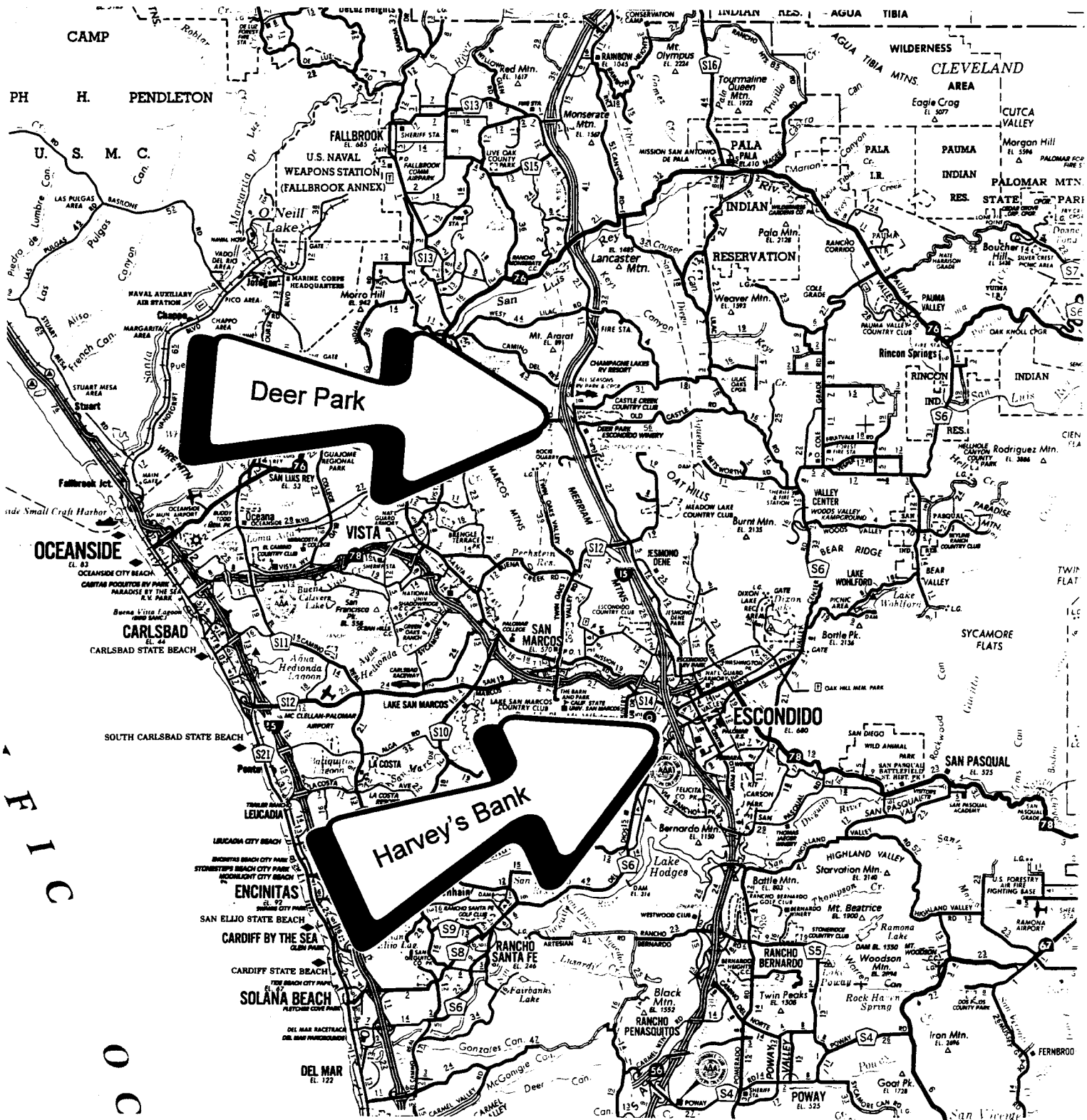

### Board Meeting Prior to AGM:

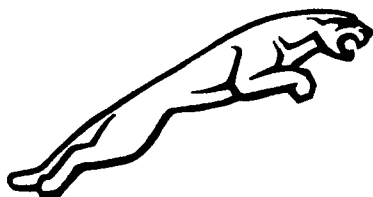
1. A new club was accepted into JCNA, No. 14, the Jaguar Club of Mexico in Mexico City, assigned to the South Central Region.

6. Officers of JCNA: Jerry Nell, President, Brock McPherson, Vice President, Barry Goldstein, Treasurer, Dick Howe, Secretary.

### At the AGM:

1. Multi-affiliated memberships were approved with the cost being determined by the local club.
2. Class 16, Special-Interest Cars, was approved.
3. A determination of non-authenticity status of selected items: Accessories supplied by dealers on selected items such as the hood leaper, mud flaps, etc. with a standard deduction for each was approved.
4. For Series 1 E-Type engine head color, a cut-off serial number before # 876000 should be judged as "Old Gold" in color.
5. The Judge's Manual is being rewritten by Steve Kennedy, Rocky Mountain Jaguar Club.
6. The Challenge Cup was discontinued, and a new method of awarding this prize is being investigated.
7. Composition of judging teams: One member must still be licensed and a JCNA member.
