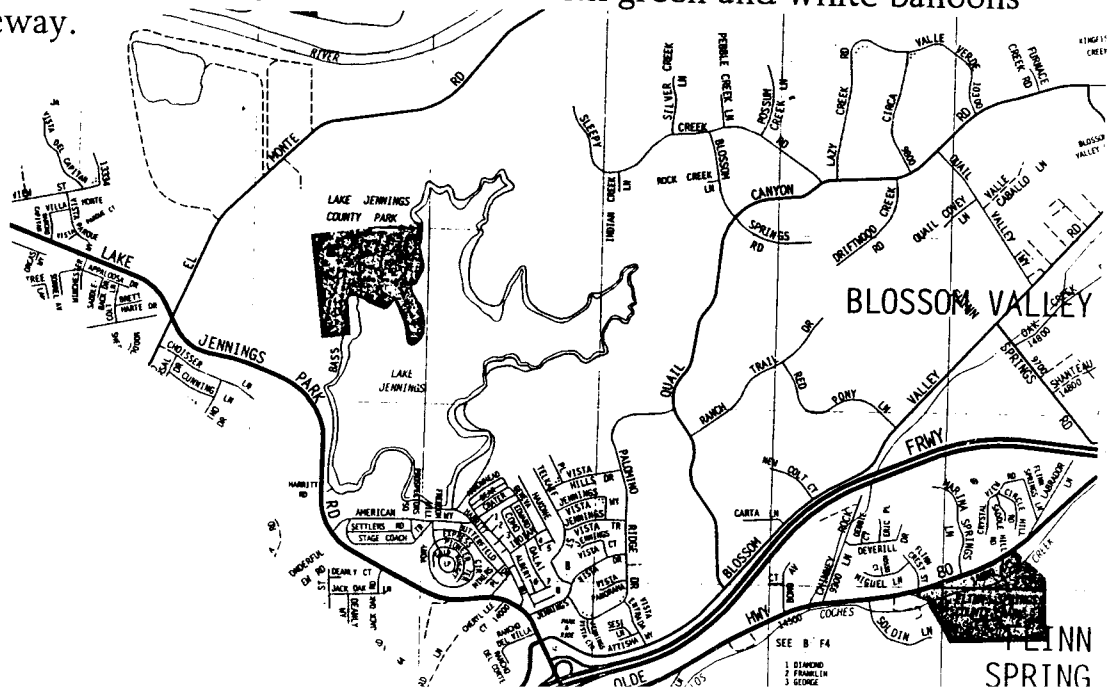
## September Dinner Meeting

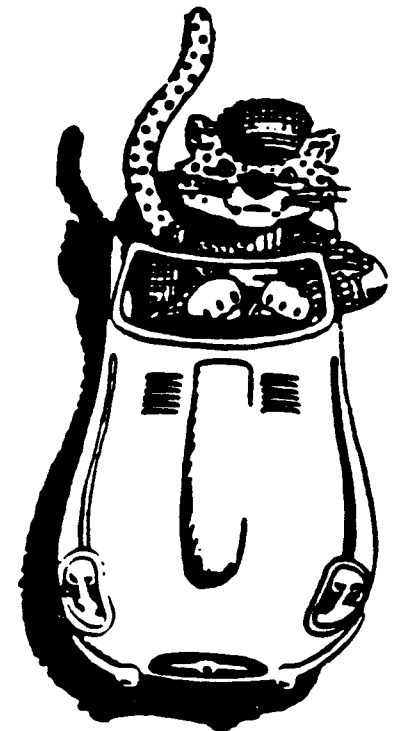

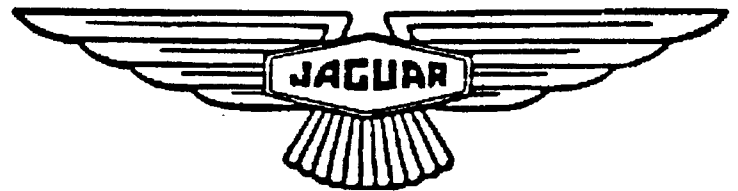
# IN THE REAR VIEW MIRROR

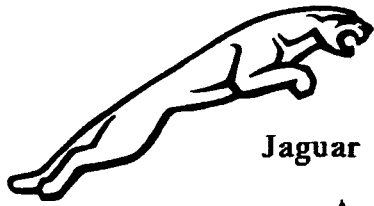



- Any object will fall so as to do the most damage to itself

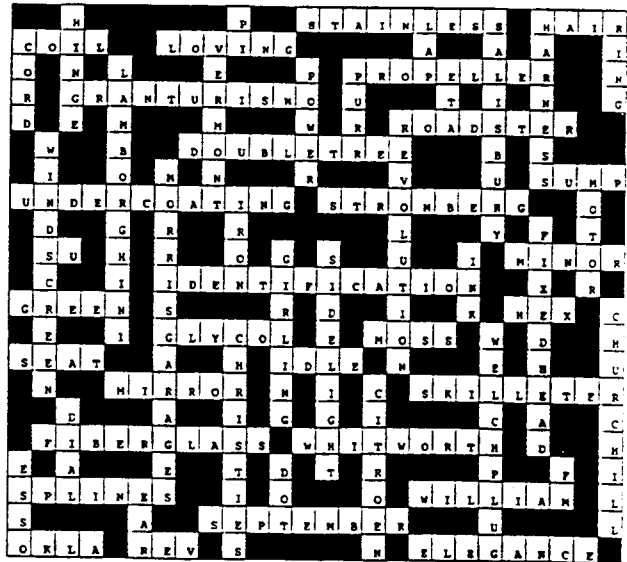
### Anthony's Law of the Workshop

## **SAN DIEGO BRITISH CAR DAY 1995**



These prices continue to provide the attendee with the best value of any car show of its type in Southern California. Pre-registration forms will be sent out in the Summer to all known British car clubs on the West Coast. Last year's event was very successful with nearly 400 cars in attendance from all over Southern California and the Southwest. Gratifyingly, over 25 different British marques were represented. In support of the marques, major US parts vendors like Moss Motors and The Roadster Factory, as well as manufacturers and vendors of unique regalia and providers of specialized services were in attendance.

Prizes are awarded to the best of each marque represented by at least three pre-registered vehicles: the best British "Beater", the long distance award for the car that came specifically for this event, People's choice of the most favorite car in attendance, and selection of the best of the prior year's best-of-marque winners.

San Diego British Car Day is one of the oldest All British marque car shows in the country, having been established as a San Diego county car club picnic in 1980. 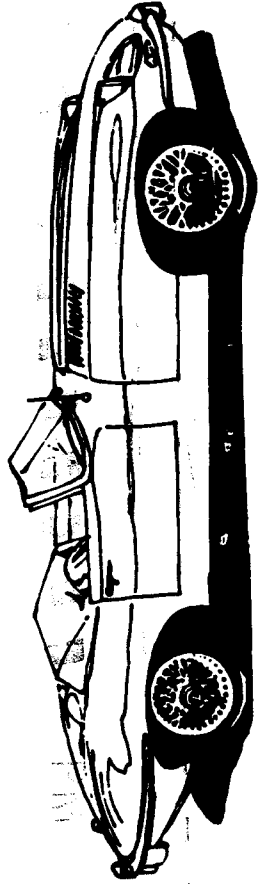
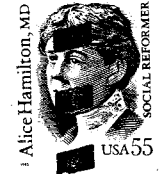
