





Sunday, March 10: Bus tour to the Behring Auto Museum in Danville.



CLUB ANNIVERSARIES

Back in Steamboat Springs, Colorado, a couple of kids named Norma and Jim Shiner got rid of their MGTD for a brand-new XK-120 DHC. It was their dream car, and though they stretched their budget to the limit, they just had to have that Jaguar! They kept it for many years, eventually trading it in on a Corvette. Time passed and then in 1975, Jim found

an XK-120 in Los Angeles (aah--deja vu") in need of TLC and brought it back to San Diego to restore. He needed help with technical details and a friend, Frank Kovack, just happened to be a member of the San Diego Jaguar Club. Frank invited Jim and Norma to a meeting at the Mission Valley in February, 1976, and the rest is history. Happy 20th, Norma and Jim!

In 1965 Randy Prine bought an XK-150S OTS for \$900 to use as his "airport" car. It had a minor mechanical problem--every time you stepped on the brakes, they stayed locked in the applied position. "What in the world do you want with that old thing?", Marilyn asked, "and what is it?" Randy heard rumors of Jaguar Club and got Bob Atkins phone number. Jim Poleski answered the phone and told Randy all about the San Diego Jaguar Club. Jane Fitzgerald invited the Prines to a dinner meeting in February, 1975, and they joined on the spot! Randy began restoring their XK-150S shortly after joining the club and won his first JCNA trophy in 1977. It's been 21 years with the SDJC for Marilyn and Randy.

In 1978, Harvey Williamson (who was working on his '70 E-type OTS) met Randy Prine at the Ocean Beach Upholstery Shop. Randy was President of SDJC and invited Harvey and Tolly to a dinner meeting. They joined the club in February, 1979. The Williamson's particularly enjoy the camaraderie of other Jaguar owners and the driving events. Harvey reports he is in the final stages of restoring his '54 XK-140 DHC.

Rick and Vickie Ezneker bought their '53 XK-120 OTS in 1967 while Rick was in the Navy, and literally drove it all over the world. After Rick retired, the '53 languished in the garage. The Ezneker's happened upon a SDJC Concours d'Elegance in 1983, and Rick was seized with inspiration and incentive! They joined the club in February, 1984.


Larry and Judy Joseph have thoroughly enjoyed the people, the driving, the events and all the activities of the SDJC since they joined in February, 1985. Larry is recovering from surgery on January 4th, and they hope to get back into the swing of things very soon.

Dick Cavicke met Jack Butler and Dick Fuller at at a Wings for Wheels event at the Aerospace Museum and they invited Dick and Ginny to the SDJC. They joined the club in 1985, and in June, they took their '52 XK-120 to the Los Angeles concours and won third place. In 1986, the Cavicke's placed third in the National JCNA Concours Results with a three-show average of 99.626! Dick has served as Vice-President, President, Concours Chairman and Chief Judge.

When Bob and Dorothy Campbell bought their 1969 XJ-6, it was just three years old, and they discovered it was actually a 1968, the third to be manufactured. The first car was an experimental one, and the second was bought by the Japanese. The Jaguar which eventually became theirs was the one brought from England to be shown in NYC. In 1983, when Bob retired, they brought their Jaguar with them from Boston and resettled in La Jolla. They saw a SDJC newsletter, found out about the club and joined in February, 1988. Needless to say, their unique XJ-6 is their pride and joy.

Dick Klise was a bachelor when he first joined SDJC in 1988, but if you'll notice the picture in the roster shows his beautiful wife, Lisa, and Dick on their wedding day, taken in their '69 E-type OTS.

E-TYPE JAGUAR

Following are excerpts from an article by Paul Skilleter taken from the March-April, 1991, <u>Jaquar Journal</u>:

The E-type (as it was known outside the US) was launched in Europe at the March 1961 Geneva Salon in Switzerland, and in America at the New York Show of April 1961. This was at least a year later than Jo Eerdmans, President of Jaguar Cars since 1953, would have liked, as sales of the XK-150 were already declining as the new decade approached. But when the car was finally seen, the first year's production was sold immediately and, for many years afterwards, sales of the E-type were constrained only by the ability of the factory to make them.

Technically, the XK-E was a tour de force and incorporated much race-car engineering, modelled directly on the D-type Jaguar which had won the Le Mans 24-hours in 1955, 1956 and 1957. It had a stressed-skin centre section with the engine and front suspension carried by a tubular frame. The engine was the 3.8 litre XK unit already tried in triple-carburetor form in the XK 150S - a six-cylinder in a world of V8s but one which thanks to its highly efficient twin-overhead camshaft cylinder head, gave a high specific output for its fairly modest capacity.

The independent rear suspension was all-new and was a masterly design, combining almost sedan-like comfort with great handling characteristics. Not surprising, really, as it had principally been designed for the Mk X sedan launched a little later in 1961. Two body styles were announced, both strictly two-seaters—a roadster and a delightful fixed-head coupe with an opening rear "hatch".

All this, plus the looks, for \$6,000. The XK-E was a marketing man's dream.









From the February/March, 1996, issue of <u>Sports Car</u> International:

At the World Classic Auction, Las Vegas, October, 1995, a 1974 Jaguar S3 V12 Roadster, burgundy/tan, stick shift, air, chrome wires. Full restoration to a good standard, trunklid slightly bowed. (Probably from trying to get too many spare parts inside.) Some sanding marks. As long as the power steering works, these nose-heavy beasts are pretty fun to drive, but prices for imperfect examples aren't moving. The big cat SOLD at a market-correct \$28,500.

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






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
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
