#### **NEEDS YOUR HELP!**

At the November Board Meeting, the club voted to sponsor a XK-120 Roadster which has been donated to the Automobile Museum in Balboa Park. Our sponsorship is for our time and expertise, not financial. Bill Kellner is in charge of the resoration and has submitted a list of jobs that need to be done, as well as tax-deductible donations of equipment and parts:


- 1. Clean mud and grease from front and rear end.
- 2. Rebuild master and wheel cylinders.
- 3. Remove stripped block and transmission.
- 4. Inspect clutch and replace if necessary.
- 5. Check all main and rod bearings.
- 6. Remove pistons, inspect rings and "mic" bores after honing.
- 7. Construct engine.
- 8. Remove viewable harnesses, clean, re-color outer covers, put back on car.
- 9. Remove and polish chrome pieces.
- 10. Remove seats for refurbishing.
- 11. Treat interior leather with "Hide Food".
- 12. Remove interior carpeting, etc., for cleaning or renewal.
- 13. Clean and paint exposed chassis.
- 14. Clean and treat rear leather spring gaiters with "Hide Food".
- 15. Strip car for re-painting and replace after painting.

Needed: Lucas SLC-700 fog lamp unit with clear convex lense and chromed "Bullet" in center. Do not need the entire lamp, just the light unit. These are 7 inch lenses which used to be called, "flame-throwers".

Equipment: Small milling machine, sand-blasting cabinet, steam cleaning machine. Any other tools or equipment are gratefully received and tax-deductible.

The restoration shop is located at 12th and Market and is open Wednesdays and Saturdays. Give Bill a call at 745-8342, if you have any questions.







At the November Business Meeting (11/13) the problem of ever-tightening Smog Regulations was discussed. Those of us who own and drive classic cars are particularly concerned. If the new proposed "Smog II" rules are enacted, vintage cars could be precluded from being driven. After painstaking research, countless hours of labor and thousands of dollars in restoration costs, the cars could not be registered because of Smog Requirements demanded by the State.

The Jaguar Owners Club, Inc. (L.A. area) had an excellent article addressing this problem in their current newsletter. A proposed letter was enclosed which requested State Senators and Assemblypersons make an adequate study of the effect of such rules on the millions of citizens who would be economically devastated before they enact them.

We have drawn up a similar letter and will have it available at the Holiday Dinner Dance, along with information on your State Senator or Assemblyman. Please let your elected officials know we do not want our vintage automobiles to become nothing but museum pieces.

<u>Membership:</u> Roger reported 110 paid memberships, and renewals for '97 being received. Harvey has details on "Leaper Program" put together by JCNA to assist local clubs to increase membership. He will give to Randy and Roger for review. Voted into membership were Harry and Doris Allgawer and John and Marilyn Greenbush.

<u>Hospitality:</u> Pam suggested we revive the greeter program of a few years ago where specific members assigned to greet and introduce new members at dinner meetings.

<u>Dinners:</u> Holiday Party on Dec. 14: Roger has booked the band, "Melody Makers", Diane to receive reservations and return gate passes. We will send invitations to the Cushman's, Stein's and Joe Hernandez (Dist. Manager for Jaguar) to be our guests. It was decided to support the North County fire victims with our donations at this year's party. The Red Cross is in need of cash donations, so club will accept cash or checks made out to Red Cross, specifying the North County Fire Victims. Discussed location for January dinner. Jan Burton suggested Kona Kai and will get more details for newsletter.

Events: A fish fry at the Barrett Junction is planned for January.

JCNA Business Meeting: Randy (SW Rep.) attended this meeting in South Carolina in October. (See Randy's report in Nov. Newsletter). Regarding the Jaguar Owners Club, Inc., of Southern California (formerly Los Angeles) name change, Randy received a call from David Iwerks, President. He will present this matter at their Dec. Board Meeting to see if their members wish to withdraw "Southern California" from the name change due to the objections by SDJC.

<u>Museum:</u> Dick reported California legislature has reopened discussion on Smog II. As it now stands any car designated a 'gross polluter' must be fixed with no limit on the cost. In the future there is a possibility that these cars could be confiscated by the State.

New Business: Bill Kellner moved, Tracy seconded, that SDJC sponsor the XK-120 that has been donated to the museum for restoration. This sponsorship is for time, expertise and not financial sponsorship. The museum restoration shop is located at 12th and Market and is open Wednesday and Saturday. Bill will put together a description of the tasks and expertise needed as well as his number as contact person. Motion passed.

A motion was made, seconded and passed to rent a post office box for use by the club at a central location. Randy will rent the box at the Midway post office with the intent that this would be a permanent location. Diane volunteered to print labels on her computer for use by the club. She will be reimbursed for cost of supplies.

<u>Adjournment:</u> 8:40 p.m. No formal business meeting in December, however, the new Board will meet for a planning session.


