Remembering 1988 ...

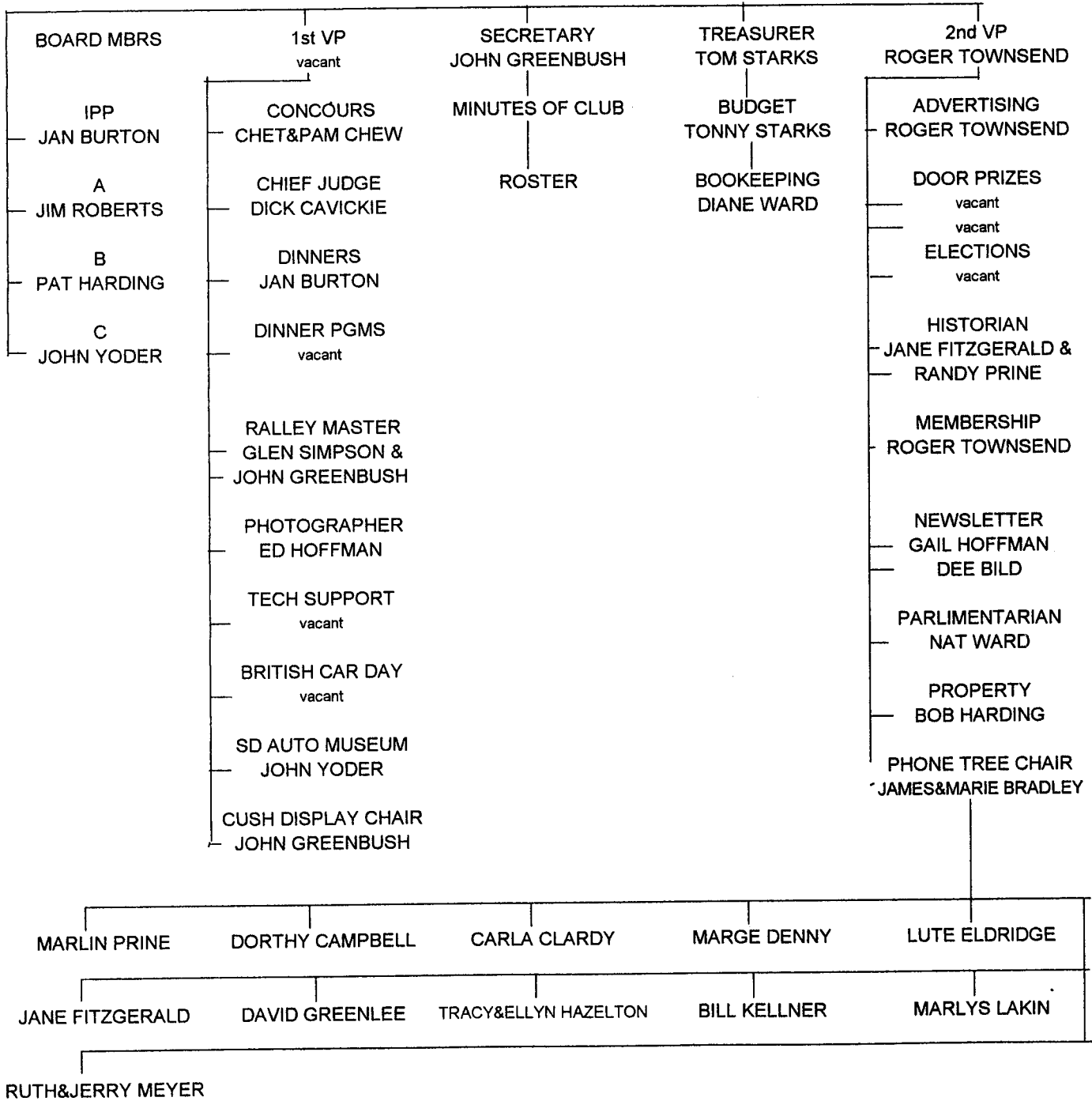
