# Tech Tips for the Mechanically Adept

Tip of the Week April 28, 2000

Leaking brake master cylinder- XJ40 1988- 92

If you have to add brake fluid occasionally and the inner wing panel below the master cylinder is becoming a mess- perhaps its easier to fix than it looks.

The reservoir spigots into the side of the master cylinder in two places. There are rubber seals where they are connected which are available separately. This can be done with the master cylinder in place. On the bottom of the reservoir, there is a roll pin, which attaches the reservoir to the master cylinder. Tap this roll pin through the reservoir with a small punch and hammer. As you carefully pry the reservoir off of the master, tip it to make less mess. Put the new seals in place. Use a little brake fluid or Vaseline to help install the seals. Re-install the reservoir. Refill with new brake fluid. Be sure to use the correct DOT 4 fluid. Use aerosol brake cleaner to clean the reservoir and the old brake fluid mess.



Tip of the Week: May 5, 2000

No start, sometimes start

XJ-6, XJ-12, XJS 1969 to 1987 and some others

When you turn the key to start position and nothing happens- does the horn blow? If the horn sounds good, the battery is probably ok. Check the battery connections. You can sort of do this from the driver's seat by having someone watch the headlights. Turn them on and try the starter. If the headlights go from bright to dim, clean the battery connections- both ends of the cables, (though the one's on the battery are usually the dirty ones).

If the headlights remain bright when you try the starter, the problem is in the starter circuit. Most likely culprit is the starter relay- a large relay located on the firewall, right of center for sedans and right inner wing (fender) panel at rear for XJS. This relay has about six wires, two of which are large. The large brown wire is the power from the battery. The large white with red stripes is the power to the starter solenoid. With the key on, run position, and transmission in park (or neutral with the hand brake set), pull the two large wires off and touch the ends together. The starter should engage and turn the engine over, starting the engine. Re-install leads on the relay. If nothing happens, you have a power supply problem to the relay, or, a starter problem. If the starter worked, pay attention to how firmly attached the two large relay wires were. If they nearly fall off, the problem could just be poor connections or burnt relay. The problem can also be neutral safety switch or ignition switch, or poor connections elsewhere.

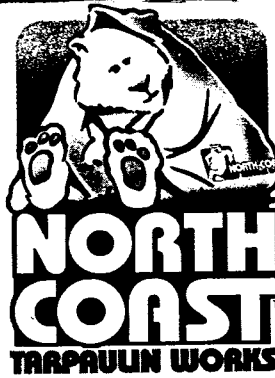

In 1962 Bob Fitzgerald was elected President of the SDJC. Other officers were Vice President Richard C. Adams, Secretary Cleo Adams and Treasurer Ken Marvin.

In 1962 rallying was very popular with car clubs in the San Diego area. There was a rally being run almost every month. In March, the Convair Sports Car Club held one with 142 cars entered. SDJC was represented by nine entries. Jane and Bob Fitzgerald would have placed first in the Novice Class had Bob, in his infinite wisdom, entered the Open Class resulting in their finishing 18<sup>th</sup>.

The Don Diego Rally was held in May. SDJC member Pat Harding still has the trophy that her father, Buck Kelly, won by placing first in his class.

The Third SDJC Concours d'Elegance was held at the Town & Country Hotel in Mission Valley. There were 110 cars on display, with 50 being judged. Participants were not only from San Diego, but from all of Southern California. Twelve different car dealers displayed 36 new cars. Entertainment for the banquet was furnished by the members of the San Diego Starlight Opera.

The Christmas party that year was held at the Hotel Del Coronado.

1962 was certainly a busy year for the SDJC and all other car clubs in the area. Where has all the enthusiasm gone?

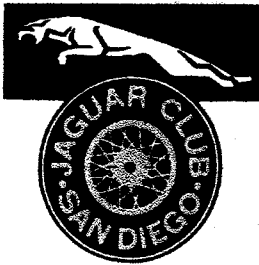
